CONSTITUTION OF THE ARKANSAS-LOUISIANA CONFERENCE OF SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTISTS

Effective October 27, 2024

ARTICLE I--NAME

The name of this organization shall be known as the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, hereinafter referred to as the conference.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this conference is to make disciples of Jesus Christ who live as His loving witnesses and proclaim to all people the everlasting gospel of the Three Angels' Messages in preparation for His soon return (Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 1:8, Revelation 14:6-12).

ARTICLE III--RELATIONSHIPS

The Arkansas-Louisiana Conference is a member unit of the Southwestern Union Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and is located in the territory of the North American Division of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. The purposes, policies, and procedures of this conference shall be in harmony with the working policies and procedures enacted by the executive committee of the North American Division or the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. This conference shall pursue the mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in harmony with the Fundamental Beliefs, programs, initiatives, and actions adopted and approved by the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists in its sessions.

ARTICLE IV--TERRITORY

The territory of this conference shall consist of the states of Arkansas and Louisiana, and the city of Texarkana, Texas.

ARTICLE V—MEMBERSHIP/CONSTITUENCY

The membership/constituency of this conference shall consist of such churches and companies as have been or shall be properly organized in any part of the geographic territory under its jurisdiction and formally approved for membership by vote of the delegates at any regular or special conference constituency session. Such churches shall remain members unless expelled by a simple majority vote of the delegates in a properly called constituency session of the conference.

ARTICLE VI--BYLAWS

The members of this conference, acting in and through a conference constituency session, may enact bylaws, and/or repeal them, and such bylaws may embrace any provision not inconsistent with the constitution or with the current local conference model constitution and bylaws approved by the Executive Committee of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. While we recognize multiple language groups throughout our constituency and will make every effort to accommodate translation at our sessions, the principal business language of the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference is English and its governing documents shall be in English.

ARTICLE VII—DISSOLUTION AND DISPOSITION OF ASSETS

This conference may be dissolved only by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the delegates present and voting at any constituency session.

In the event of the dissolution of this conference and unless otherwise required by local law, all assets remaining after all claims have been satisfied shall be transferred to a legal entity authorized by the North American Division of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists.

ARTICLE VIII--AMENDMENTS

The bolded text of this constitution and bylaws shall be periodically reviewed and amended to conform as far as locally appropriate to the local conference model constitution and bylaws when it is amended by action of the General Conference Executive Committee at an Annual Council. Such amendments shall be adopted into the conference constitution and bylaws by a simple majority vote (unless local law requires a higher majority) of delegates present and voting at a conference constituency session. This conference may amend the unbolded text of the constitution and bylaws from time to time at a conference constituency session provided any such changes are in harmony with the spirit and intent of the model constitution and bylaws. Such amendments shall require an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the delegates present and voting.
